We open a new Academic Year with all the excitement that new beginnings bring, and plenty of memorable musical performances ahead to delight you all. It has been wonderful to build upon the strong musical tradition of the School and to extend our reach to audiences both local and beyond.

Lawrence Power and Simon Crawford-Phillips open our Celebrity series with a viola recital which promises to be charged with intensity and freshness. Bursting with youthful energy, the Piatti Quartet (with alumnus Tetsuumi Nagata on the viola) revisit the chamber music canon with their personal reading of works by Purcell, Haydn and Schubert.

In February, we will celebrate Beethoven's 250th anniversary with a remarkable double bill, encompassing his complete works for cello and piano performed by alumnus Colin Carr and Thomas Sauer. We are also thrilled to welcome back alumna Tasmin Little as part of her farewell tour. Tasmin and longstanding collaborator Piers Lane will offer an exciting programme in which Brahms and Delius will mix with Franck and Boulanger.

Alongside the highly informative and enjoyable lecture by Peter Medhurst, our season will also include visits from The Cobham Band, London Concertante and The Grange, plus a spot of swing with Watermill Jazz and the Piccadilly Dance Orchestra.

The performances of our pupils form the backbone of every season and there are plenty of opportunities to enjoy their playing in our Showcase Concerts. This Autumn Term we are offering three Christmas Showcase Concerts in response to ever-increasing demand for seats. These will close with the School Orchestra performing Gustav Mahler's iconic *Adagietto* from his *Symphony No 5* – a high point in the School's calendar, and one not to be missed.

Lawrence Power is one of today's foremost violists, in demand worldwide as a recitalist, concerto soloist and chamber musician. As a recitalist, he has performed at Wigmore Hall, LSO St Luke's and at the Lincoln Center in New York. He has developed an acclaimed

partnership with pianist Simon Crawford-Phillips (a soloist, chamber musician and conductor himself), and together they have performed around the world as well as recorded celebrated CDs on the Hyperion label of Shostakovich and Brahms' viola sonatas, and York Bowen's complete works for viola and piano.

Peter Medhurst explores the Romantic period in music and the arts by discussing the various aspects that shape its character: the Napoleonic wars, the rise of nationalism, the subjective in Romantic expression, the importance of nature, the supernatural and the Gothic, and the wars of independence.

The day is illustrated throughout with images and live examples performed by Peter and his team. Music includes Beethoven's *Piano Sonata No 26 in Eb major Op 81a*; Schubert's *Erlkönig*; Field's *Nocturne No 1*; Schumann's *Dichterliebe* and Liszt's *Hungarian Dances*.



With Thomas Sauer, Colin has played recitals in New York, Boston, Philadelphia, the Concertgebouw in Amsterdam, and Wigmore Hall. He has performed complete cycles of the Bach *Solo Suites* at Wigmore Hall and at the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center.

Winner of many prestigious international awards including First Prize in the Naumburg Competition, Second Prize in the Rostropovich International Cello Competition and also winner of the Young Concert Artists competition, Colin Carr's Beethoven double bill promises to be truly memorable.

ACCESSIBILITY

The Menuhin Hall is a level access venue with seating for disabled patrons in the Circle and Stalls. Patrons who need the assistance of a frame or crutches should apply for a disabled space in the Auditorium and, if required, an adjoining seat for a companion. If, after having purchased tickets, a Patron suffers a disability, the Box Office should be contacted for advice.



Wheelchair patrons will be issued with a parking permit to enable level access to the venue. Issued permits

will ensure that a seat is removed in the Auditorium to allow wheelchair access. Only wheelchair patrons displaying Menuhin Hall parking permits may park in these bays.



Blue badge holders may park in the six unreserved bays available in the lower car park. Please note that access to The Menuhin Hall from the lower car park involves 13 steps and an 80 yard walk. Patrons who require level access to the Hall can be dropped off behind the Hall in the parking permit area between 6.45pm and 7pm. Assistance can be provided by a member of staff if required.



A loop system is installed in the Hall. Headsets for infrared audio are available from the Box Office.



Guide Dogs are welcome. Please advise the Box Office when booking so that an appropriate aisle seat can be provided.


