It is with a certain feeling of the unexpected that I find myself writing to you all to invite you to share our Spring Summer Season, after what feels like only a few weeks since my very first introduction.

These past months were filled to the brim with some outstanding performances and, as we look ahead, I am very pleased to share the outline of our Season – a varied and exciting combination of the classical canon and lesser-known gems.

We start by welcoming the Linos Trio (formed by our very own alumni Prach Boondiskulchok and Vladimir Waltham) who will treat us to a selection of pieces gathered from the ghostly and the supernatural, including a very small contribution of my own. The prize-winning Castalian Quartet will perform for us after having worked for several days with our pupils earlier in the year. We are also very glad to be able to reschedule Bart LaFollette and Caroline Palmer's postponed recital, plus welcome back Imogen Cooper, who needs no introduction. Imogen returns to offer a recital including Beethoven's *Diabelli Variations* and Schoenberg's *Six Little Pieces* Op 19, a collection of highly Romantic musical postcards.

The School always reserves a special place to celebrate its Founder. This year, we welcome back Jeremy and Mookie Menuhin alongside Gary Hoffmann who will join forces with the School's Junior Orchestra to perform Bach's *Concerto for two pianos in C minor*, BWV 1060.

You will also find in the busy calendar a plethora of interesting visitors. For the first time, we will welcome the Investec International Music Festival with the Belcea Quartet (led by alumna Corina Belcea), host a charity concert in aid of Sight for Surrey and welcome back the National Youth Harp Orchestra. Watermill Jazz visit us for the second time this academic year, and Peter Medhurst will offer valuable insight about the Viennese years of Mozart.

Add to this our regular Showcases through the Season, plus the Summer Festival and the Orchestral Picnic Concert, and it becomes quite difficult to decide what not to attend!

We look forward to welcoming you to our concerts and events in the Hall, and we are also very excited to welcome our new Head, Kate Clanchy, to the School's international family – I am sure some of you will have met her already in some of our events earlier in the year.

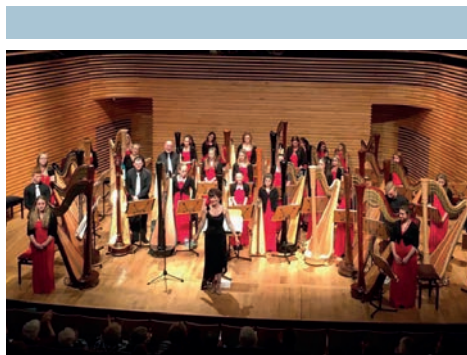

ACCESSIBILITY

The Menuhin Hall is a level access venue with seating for disabled patrons in the Circle and Stalls. Patrons who need the assistance of a frame or crutches should apply for a disabled space in the Auditorium and, if required, an adjoining seat for a companion. If, after having purchased tickets, a Patron suffers a disability, the Box Office should be contacted for advice.



Wheelchair patrons will be issued with a parking permit to enable level access to the venue. Issued permits will ensure that a seat is removed in the Auditorium to allow wheelchair access. Only wheelchair patrons displaying Menuhin Hall parking permits may park in these bays.



Blue badge holders may park in the 6 unreserved bays available in the lower car park. Please note that access to the Menuhin Hall from the lower car park involves 13 steps and approximately an 80 yard walk. Patrons who require level access to the Hall can be dropped off behind the Hall in the parking permit area between 6.45pm and 7pm. Assistance can be provided by a member of staff, if required.



A loop system is installed in the Hall. Headsets for infrared audio are available from the Box Office.



Guide Dogs are welcome. Please advise the Box Office when booking so that an appropriate aisle seat can be provided.

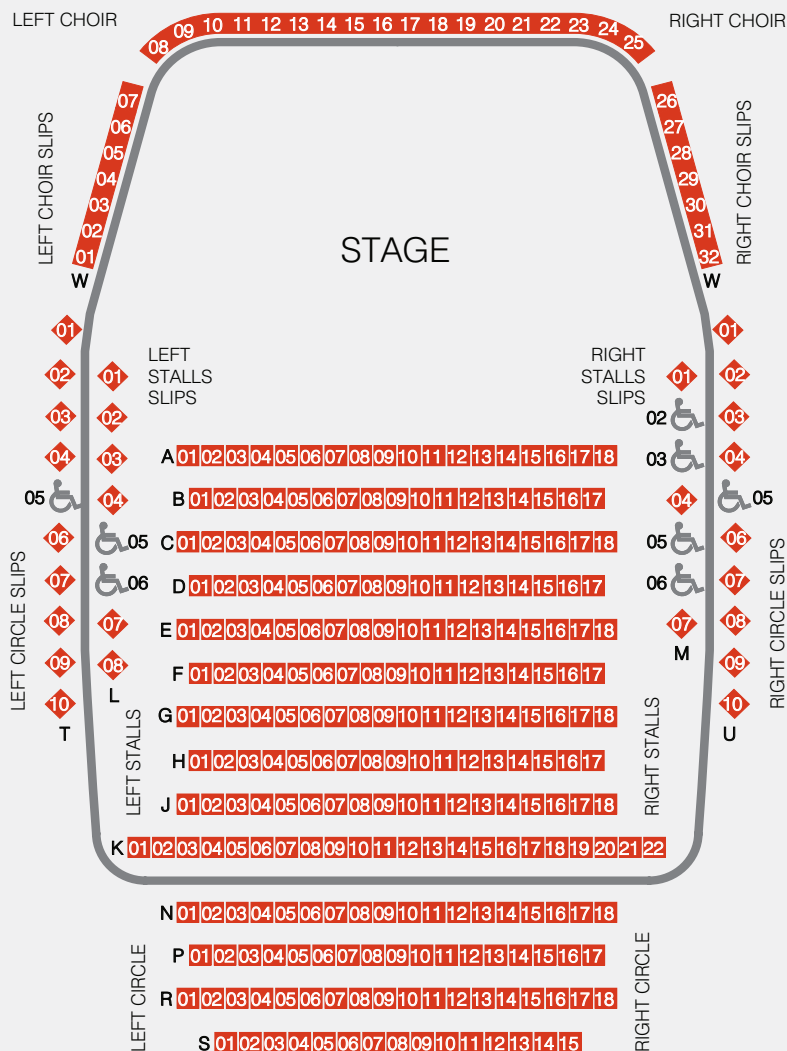
