

Job Description

School Nurse/Matron

The School Nurse/Matron plays a key role in the life of this small specialist music school, providing healthcare and support to all our pupils. We are looking for a qualified, experienced, enthusiastic nurse to run the School's health centre and to assist the Houseparents in the day-to-day care of the pupils. Applicants should have excellent communication skills, demonstrate flexibility and initiative, be fully committed to the School's ethos and have a love of music.

Conditions of Service

The post is part-time 30 hours a week term-time only.

The position could be combined with the role of Assistant Houseparent in one of the residential houses, taking a full part in the life of the School. Accommodation may therefore be available for a suitable candidate.

Salary will be within the range of Band 6 (RCN pay scale) according to previous experience.

Responsibilities

The main responsibilities of the School Nurse include:

- To promote the safety and wellbeing of pupils at all times
- To provide effective, high-quality nursing and pastoral care to pupils
- To provide advice and first aid care to all members of the school community
- To adhere at all times to the Nursing and Midwifery Council Code for standards of conduct, performance and ethics
- To work closely with the Senior Nurse/Head of Pastoral Care, the School Counsellor and with boarding, academic, music and support staff to promote the wellbeing of all pupils
- To maintain accurate nursing and accident records
- To arrange appointments at the local GP surgery as required
- To transport pupils to appointments
- To store, administer and order medication correctly
- To organise immunisations in school and at the local GP surgery in accordance with the national childhood immunisation programme
- To be responsible for your own continuing professional development and to undertake training as appropriate
- To undertake any other duties as required by the Senior Nurse or the Head in order to meet the changing needs and demands of this busy school
- To conduct yourself with professionalism at all times as a representative of Yehudi Menuhin School
